

Barrington boost for hard of hearing.

Wimborne and Ferndown Lions Club have given the Barrington Centre, Ferndown a donation of £822 for a new hearing loop for the theatre main hall

This new version of an induction loop, made by Ampertronics of Nottingham, enables people with hearing aids to hear, clearly, the sound they want with no background noise. It works by creating a magnetic field direct from the sound source which can be picked up by the hearing aid coil.

Office manager Rosemary Handscomb said that the new loop is already in operation and is a big improvement on the old system

96 Christmas Food Parcels from the Lions

The annual delivery of Christmas food parcels to local people has been made again by Wimborne and Ferndown Lions club.

Club members fill bags with about 25 food items from bulk supplies purchased from Morrisons of Verwood. In a well established process, stacks comprising 96 pieces of each food item are assembled on tables in the Scout Hut. Club members then circulate, filling the bags with one from each stack (see below). The bags are then delivered to people most in need who have been notified to the Lions from local Social Services, CABs and GPs etc.

This year the Club was ably assisted by Verwood's new Mayor, Mrs Pat Morrow, who took an active part in the bag-filling process.

We would like to thank the Mayor for her support and also thank the Verwood Scouts for the use of their hall for the parcel assembly

In this annual event, organised by Lion Brenda Gait, some 54 boards were set up in local pubs and shops, Sports clubs and garden centres.

Each board contains 60 squares which members of the public can buy for £1 a square. When the board is full a draw is made to pick the winning square, the winner receiving a giant Easter egg..

The 54 draws raised £2833 (less cost of the eggs).

This year the draws profit went to two of our major beneficiaries, the Dorset and Somerset Air Ambulance and the John Thornton Young Achievers Foundation.

Combining to keep someone warm

The Lions club of Wimborne and Ferndown have combined with the Lighthouse Trust and Bournemouth Health to enable a local man stave off winter's worst.

Following advice from the Citizens Advice Bureau that this man was suffering with a broken boiler and no funds to replace it, the three parties agreed to split the cost of a new boiler and installation (£1800) with a happy result.

Combining to save lives

After lengthy discussions the club agreed to pay roughly half the cost (just over £1000) with Ferndown Town Council for a defibrillator for Ferndown.

The defibrillator will be positioned on the outside wall of the Barrington Theatre facing Tescos and will be installed and maintained by the Barrington

SPECTREK – recycling your specs

New glasses can be expensive and are quite unaffordable in many parts of the world. Old glasses are often thrown away, but they can be recycled.

Wimborne and Ferndown Lions, along with other Lions clubs, have been collecting unwanted pairs of spectacles which are then refurbished, cleaned and graded and prepared for distribution in third world countries where eye care is often unavailable and lens making facilities are non-existent.

This year Wimborne and Ferndown Lions have provided the local collection centre. The club themselves have collected 4,700 pairs and the total assembled from our area is over 23,000 pairs.

Bournemouth,Boscombe,Christchurch,Lymington,Poole and Ringwood & Fordingbridge Lions Clubs all contributed. The club would like to thank the local opticians and doctor's surgeries who have contributed to the collecting process.*It has been calculated that the cost of the scheme (paid by the Lions) is around 5p per pair.

About Lions Clubs International

It has 19,000 active members belonging to 900 Lions Clubs located throughout Great Britain and Ireland. Each Club supports a range of projects in its local community, including health and youth initiatives

Lions Clubs undertake hundreds of fund-raising activities in cities, towns and villages, with 100% of monies raised going direct to good causes.
